June 18, 2026**

CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Commissioner Goodwin called the regular meeting of the Board of Fire Commissioners of Benton County Fire District Protection District #4 to order at 5:00 p.m. at 2604 Bombing Range Rd., West Richland, Washington. The board members present at this meeting were Commissioner Brink and Commissioner Goodwin. Commissioner Van Beek was excused.

MOTION: Commissioner Brink moved to approve the Consent Agenda. Commissioner Goodwin seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The revenue and expenditure budget position report were reviewed.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There was no unfinished business.

NEW BUSINESS

Resolution No. 2026-08; Retirement

Commissioner Brink read Resolution No. 2026-08, a resolution recognizing and honoring the service of Robert Shannon upon his retirement from Benton County Fire Protection District #4.

MOTION: Commissioner Brink moved to adopt Resolution No. 2026-08, recognizing and honoring the service of Robert Shannon upon his retirement. Commissioner Goodwin seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

Deputy Chief Drayton presented Firefighter Shannon with a commemorative award in recognition of his 18 years of dedicated service. Cake and refreshments were served following the presentation.

Insurance Quote

The District's insurance broker submitted a proposal from Selective Insurance. Staff provided a comparison of the Selective proposal and the District's current coverage through Enduris.

Although the Selective proposal would provide annual premium savings, the Board determined that Enduris offers broader specialty coverage and public entity protections better suited to fire district operations.

Life Assist Quote No. 466904 and No. 466906

The Board reviewed Life Assist Quote No. 466904 for IV pump devices in the amount of \$15,337.00, plus applicable taxes and shipping, and Life Assist Quote No. 466906 for ventilators in the amount of \$41,276.00, plus applicable taxes and shipping.

The Board requested that Quote No. 466906 be tabled pending verification of whether a service agreement is included.

MOTION: Commissioner Brink moved to approve Life Assist Quote No. 466904 in the amount of \$15,337.00, plus taxes and shipping. Commissioner Goodwin seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

CORRESPONDENCE

There was no new correspondence.

DISTRICT REPORTS

Logistics – Logistics Manager Rebman provided an update on ongoing projects throughout the District.

City Liaison – Commissioner Brink reported that the West Richland City Council discussed potential changes to the City's fireworks ordinances; however, no changes were adopted. So far there will be 18 fireworks sales locations operating this year.

He also reported that approximately 15 police officers will be on duty July 4, with resources strategically deployed to support fireworks enforcement and public safety. Police Chief Fry is coordinating with Fire Chief Carlyle and Deputy Chief Drayton regarding enforcement activities.

Commissioner Brink noted the upcoming Benton Rural Electric Association grand opening and reported that the Van Giesen Street and Keene Road intersection remains closed due to roundabout construction.

Commissioners – Commissioner Brink attended the Washington Fire Commissioners Association Spring Seminar and reported that it was informative and beneficial.

Operations Program – Battalion Chief Borshowa submitted the following written report:

- ALS License Upgrade - Special thanks to everyone for their patience and assistance throughout this process. We began pursuing the ALS license upgrade on September 8 of last year, and the process has now been completed. As a result of the upgrade, all ambulance equipment must now meet ALS standards. Ambulances may continue to operate with EMT-Basic personnel; however, when staffed with a paramedic, at least one additional crew member must be EMT-Basic certified or higher, which the District can readily accommodate.
- Dr. Hodges will conduct his first live lecture with Benton County Fire District #4 personnel on June 25 at Station 420. This will provide valuable one-on-one interaction between Dr. Hodges and District providers.

Deputy Chief – Deputy Chief Drayton reported on the following items:

- The District will increase staffing on July 2–4 and utilize an area command structure to improve coordination and incident management.
- Work continues on the digital radio system transition. Project review identified incomplete milestones and the need for a formal implementation plan, resulting in a delay to deployment.
- Overtime costs are expected to exceed budget due to Station 410 staffing, the recruit academy, and summer operational demands. Three personnel are serving in acting officer roles while completing required training. The Board requested regular staffing and overtime updates, with a forecast to be presented in July.
- Staff are evaluating a transition from ImageTrend to First Due. If funded, implementation would begin in September, with full transition planned for January 1. The system would provide EMS charting, incident reporting, personnel management, and future expansion opportunities.

Financial Manager – Financial Manager Paden-Lilly reported the following:

- She is preparing the mid-year budget review for internal review prior to presentation to the Board.
- The 2025 State Auditor's Office audit report has been submitted and will be distributed to the Board.
- Archbright's recommendations are being incorporated into the Employee Handbook. A final draft will be presented to the Board for approval.

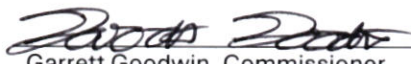
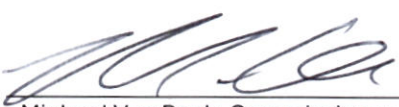

2026 MID-YEAR BUDGET REVIEW BENTON COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT #4

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The District's financial performance through the first six months of 2026 remains consistent with the Board's adopted financial policies and budget objectives. Revenues are projected to exceed budget, expenditures remain well managed, and year-end projections indicate the District will meet all Board-adopted fund balance and reserve targets while supporting the operations and capital projects authorized in the adopted 2026 budget.

MID-YEAR FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

- **General Fund:** Revenues are projected to exceed budget, driven primarily by higher than-anticipated interest earnings, increased EMS Fund transfers in accordance with the Board's 30% reserve policy, and modest growth in other revenue sources. Despite higher personnel costs, the General Fund is projected to end the year with a carryover of approximately **\$2.02 million**, meeting the Board's four-month operating reserve policy.
- **Operations:** Career firefighter overtime and associated benefit costs are projected to exceed budget due to Station 410 staffing, the 2026 Recruit Academy, and increased summer operational demands. Current projections indicate these additional costs can be accommodated through higher-than-budgeted revenues, savings in other operating accounts, and the timing of capital expenditures.
- **Capital Planning:** Several capital projects have been deferred or rescheduled into 2027 to better align with project readiness and long-term capital planning. This approach preserves financial flexibility while allowing approximately **\$2.0 million** to be designated for the newly established Capital Replacement Fund in accordance with the District's long-term capital financing strategy.
- **EMS Fund:** The EMS Fund continues to perform above expectations and is projected to end the year with approximately **\$1.77 million**, meeting the Board's policy of maintaining reserves equal to 30% of the previous three years EMS revenues.
- **Reserve Fund:** The Reserve Fund is projected to receive a **\$430,000** transfer from the General Fund and end 2026 with approximately **\$2.995 million**, meeting the Board's adopted six-month operating reserve policy.

YEAR-END OUTLOOK

Based on current projections, the District is expected to:

- Meet the General Fund four-month reserve target.
- Meet the EMS Fund 30% reserve target.
- Meet the Reserve Fund six-month reserve target.
- Establish the Capital Replacement Fund and designate funding in accordance with the 2026 financial plan.
- Conclude 2026 in compliance with the Board's adopted financial policies and reserve objectives.

Overall, the District's financial position remains stable. Current projections indicate the District will meet all Board-adopted reserve policies and conclude 2026 in compliance with the Board's adopted financial objectives.

Re: Opposition to AMR Staging at Benton County Fire District 4 on July 4

Dear Commissioners Van Beek, Goodwin, and Brink:

I am writing to oppose allowing American Medical Response (AMR) to reside or stage at a Benton County Fire District 4 station on the Fourth of July for the purpose of serving as a potential backup response for 911 calls.

Benton County Fire District 4 provides fire and emergency medical service to the West Richland community and surrounding unincorporated areas, and EMS responses make up a significant portion of the District's emergency call volume. The firefighters, EMTs, and paramedics represented by IAFF Local 1052 are trained, committed public servants who already provide this essential emergency response work for the community.

Placing AMR inside a District station as a backup 911 resource creates serious concerns. Even if described as temporary or supplemental, this arrangement could shift bargaining unit work away from IAFF Local 1052 members. Emergency medical response is not simply a logistical need; it is core public safety work performed by the District's own professional personnel. Allowing a private ambulance provider to occupy District facilities for potential 911 response risks setting a precedent that undermines those employees and the work they are responsible for providing.

I understand that the Fourth of July can create increased demand for emergency services and that the District must plan carefully for community safety. However, any staffing or coverage plan should first rely on the District's established public safety workforce and should be developed in a way that respects the role, rights, and responsibilities of IAFF Local 1052. If additional coverage is needed, the District should work directly with Local 1052 to identify appropriate solutions that preserve bargaining unit work while meeting operational needs.

For these reasons, I urge the Board of Fire Commissioners to reject any plan that allows AMR to reside, stage, or otherwise operate from a Benton County Fire District 4 station for the purpose of providing backup 911 response on July 4. The Commissioners have an obligation to protect the integrity of its emergency response system, respect the work of IAFF Local 1052 members, and avoid any arrangement that could be viewed as subcontracting or displacing bargaining unit responsibilities.

Thank you for your time, consideration, and continued service to the residents of Benton County Fire District 4. I respectfully ask that this concern be entered into the record and considered before any final decision is made regarding July 4 staffing or staging plans.
